So, mother pleaded with them to take her, and so they took her. I saw them go. Mother was holding David in her arms, so that he would not be frightened."

A Word From Pastor Lee

Epiphany

The word, "Epiphany" means the shining of a light, a shining forth, a manifestation, an appearance, or a revelation. Every year, Epiphany falls on January 6 but we tend to celebrate it on a Sunday that is closest to that date. This year it will be celebrated at Messiah the following day on January 7.

On this special day and season of light, we will hear some words from the prophet Isaiah in chapter 60. He wrote, ""Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you." During Christmas time, we celebrate that God sent us His One and Only Son, Jesus, Who became One of Us, our Emmanuel, in a little town called Bethlehem. In Epiphany, we celebrate that Jesus, our Emmanuel, is also truly God, that Jesus is our Savior, our Redeemer. In the Gospel of John, He recorded Jesus' very words: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will

not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). This is why Epiphany is also talked about as being the Festival of Lights in the church.



Have you ever experienced total darkness before? One of the things that my youngest children like at night is a small little blue night light. They have a light in their bedroom that my wife and I have to turn on before bed time. As many of you parents know who are reading this, having a night light can come in handy. Sometimes parents need to get up to use the restroom or to get a drink of water, but many times our children are mobile during night time. Having a very small light in a very dark room does wonders to illuminate the area and provide a way to navigate. There are also many positives to having a small light: prevention from running into objects or stepping on objects like Legos or small toys (which are very painful), an awareness of who is moving or walking around. The greatest positive is that the small light is a comfort, not just for our children, but also for parents. We can take comfort in knowing where our children are and that they are okay.

That is what Jesus, our Emmanuel, our God-man, is for us. He took on flesh, became one of us, and, as the Light of the world, shone in this world. He lived a perfect life, suffered, died, and rose, giving us the gift of salvation. Through our faith or trust in Him, we live our lives in Him. This means that we share or shine His light in this world of darkness. Jesus has not only brought us comfort but He also has made us His. That is what it means to be "little Christs."

C.S. Lewis once wrote this: "The Church exists for nothing else but to draw men into Christ, to make them little Christs. If they are not doing that. all the cathedrals, clergy, missions, sermons, even the Bible itself are simply a waste of time. God became Man for no other purpose. It is even doubtful, you know, whether the whole universe was created for any other purpose" (Lewis, Mere Christianity (New York: Touchstone, 1996), 171, quoted in Vanhoozer, Faith Speaking Understanding, 114)."

So, during this Epiphany season and every single day of our lives, let us live as "little Christs" as we shine the light of Jesus in this world. Let us encourage, care for, and serve one another as a church family. Let us continue to be gathered in Jesus, around His Word, as we receive Him and then go out and shine.




