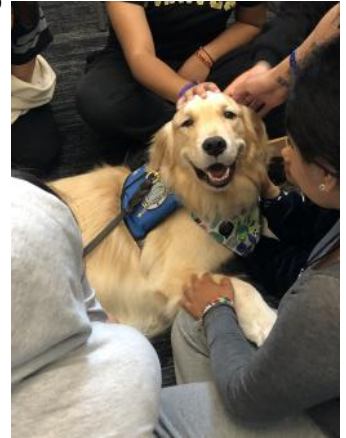




Did you know that when an LCC comfort dog is named they are also given their own bible verse? Triton's bible verse is Mark 10:45 "For even the son of man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." I used to take Triton on bi-monthly visits to the Phoenix house in downtown Dallas.

Unfortunately, it recently lost funding, so it had to close. Carolyn Nussman made the first initial visit to meet with the staff and a few board members to establish a relationship and set up a visitation schedule in January 2020. And then, the Covid crisis hit and we were unable to make visits for quite a while. Once they deemed it safe for visits, the handlers were required to go through drug and tb testing as well as a background check to protect their residents. It was a lot of effort, but definitely worth it! We made bi-monthly visits to the Phoenix House for over two years and met several wonderful teenagers in the midst of battling drug and/or alcohol addiction. I began my experience as a ministry partner and then once I became a handler, it became my regular visit with Triton. There are many wonderful memories of how God used our time there, but one in particular stands out. One of the young men I had the privilege to watch grow with the Lord every visit with Triton as his bridge. On Triton's many bandanas are his Bible verse Mark 10:45, and during one visit this young man asked me about it. The next visit, his last before he was leaving, he declared he had chosen his own bible verse Psalm 37:19 "They will not be ashamed in the time of evil, and in the days of famine they will have abundance."



Triton's impact on our church and society is immeasurable. He is a beacon of hope and a constant reminder that even in the darkest of times, there is a light to guide us. With his unwavering loyalty and unconditional love, Triton continues to inspire and uplift our community making a lasting difference in the lives of those he encounters. *Michele Haugen*

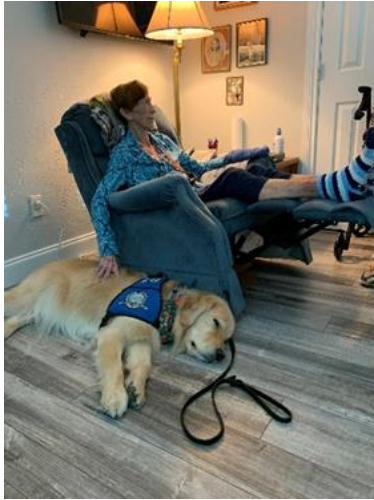
TRITON COMFORT DOG VISITS SHUT-INS

Choctaw High School Visit



The day was filled with crisscrossing the large campus. We met several of the students who were injured while attempting to climb over the 10-foot fence to get out of harm's way. The last class of the day was a visit to the ROTC room. As we entered the room, there was a young girl on the floor near the entrance of the classroom and this was where Triton decided he should stop. As the Commander told the students they had a pass on class assignments to spend time with the dogs he quietly said "especially this one" as he looked down at the student where Triton had decided to park himself. As I attempted to engage her, she said there was a problem with her mother, but beyond that she didn't share. We had a prayer together and my heart was heavy because it was obvious she was struggling emotionally. Triton did a lap (doggie hug as many of us call it) to put a smile on her face. Later we found out that on Saturday the day after the stadium shooting her mother assaulted her, police were called, and she was removed from the home and living with her best friend's family. She later returned with a police officer to retrieve her clothes only to discover her mom had destroyed every piece of clothing and everything she had. We went to comfort the students after a frightening event only to realize that students there and most likely in our own local schools often struggle with events out of their control within their families and communities.

Uvalde Anniversary Deployment 2023



Going into the week of deployment, there were feelings of apprehension, concerns and many questions. What would the mood of the town be like with all the drama the community has dealt with since the tragedy? What would the media presence be like? What would the security be like?

This is not the same community we saw pulling together in their grief immediately after the tragedy. It is now a community divided. Many who have a strong faith know they will be reunited with their love one in the future, have found purpose and are ready to move on. An example is April, Mackenna's mom. Her faith is strong, and she has now trained Makenna's Golden to serve in ministry work. Her heart is heavy for those who don't have a faith to hold onto or have drifted away. While others are on the cusp of being able to move beyond that horrific day and smile again, many others are still stuck in the anger stage of grief, continuing to point fingers and wanting justice, which in turn causes more ripple effects in the very connected community. It was wonderful to see children smiling and laughing, but often the mood would shift when in the presence of parents.

Security was high with State Troopers continuing to be a presence at the schools and in the community. The community opted for vigils, and private family events and kept it low key. LCC dispersed teams in many different directions to love on kids and staff at the schools, being on site at the town square, being present at the vigils, visiting hospital personnel, school bus depot, 911 call center, and many more. We, and other teams, had time to connect with those who have developed personal relationships in the community.

Triton met Rojelio's little sister Mary at Dalton Elementary and surprised her with a stuffie when we left that day. It was surprising to hear her talk about her mom's reaction to that day and not her own. LCC had put the word out on social media that we would have some community visiting time at Walmart. Her family came to see the dogs and were loved on by all the dogs and handlers. We later learned that this was their first interaction with the dogs because they had simply spent time together and had not interacted in many community activities.

Our God moment was meeting the Jackie Cazer's family at the cemetery. We witnessed tears being wiped as we encountered the family, but those were quickly replaced with smiles and comments of joy with Triton's presence. (Ask Jane or Marti about it!) It was heartwarming at another later event when Jazmine Cazer's, Jackie's older sister came up to Triton, lovingly grabbed his face, looked into his eyes and said "I know you!" with a big smile on her face.

We met William, a child that doesn't want to leave his home, but when he learned about the dogs at a church function, he was willing to leave to come see them. Judging by his parents' reaction, it was a special moment and, again, we shared another stuffie with the parents for him.

After a year of counseling, the teachers and staff who were in the wing the day of the tragedy, were given the opportunity to re-enter the wing where the shooting occurred to give them closure. We were asked to join with Martha and Abner's team to provide comfort.

This year has been very stressful for the teachers, students, and staff with 50+ bail-out lockdowns occurring during the school year. Bail-outs are when illegals being pursued in high-speed chases through town (only 65 miles from the border) will in desperation bail out and run. Doing the math that is about 1 or more per week! On the last day, as another handler was helping a teacher carry out items going home, it was noticed she had a bullet-proof vest in her bag. Whether this was a school distributed item or a personal purchase, one can only imagine the stress these teachers were dealing with.

Thank you, once again, to all our Messiah families who pray for this ministry and make contributions to support Triton. Without you, this opportunity to serve beyond our church would not be possible. During sharing time, we were reminded of John 1:1-5 focusing on verse 5 'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.' Please continue to pray for this community. *Marti Matz and Jane Baedke*

I just wanted to say thank you for bringing Triton to Cox Elementary this morning regarding the Allen Shooting. Peyton is also a second grader, just as Sofia was. Peyton knew her but not very well. We had the horrible task of telling Peyton what happened to her, and she just couldn't grasp it. When your eight-year-old asks, "Well, what did she do wrong? Why didn't she run? Why did he pick her?" It's a horrible feeling. Peyton loves Triton, and it was less than 10 seconds, and she found him out of all the other dogs. Thank you so much for bringing Triton into her church life. She instantly felt better. His purpose is a blessing to many. -Keri Moyer

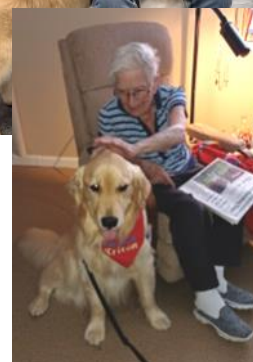

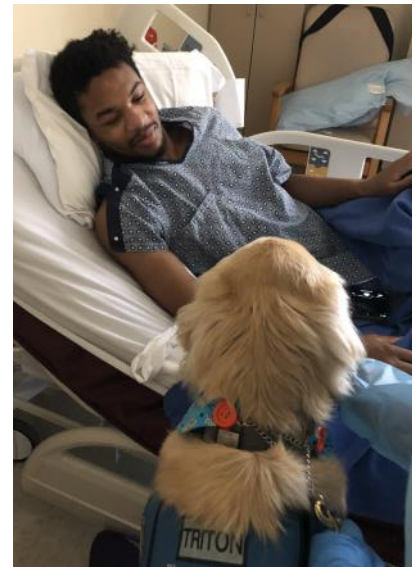

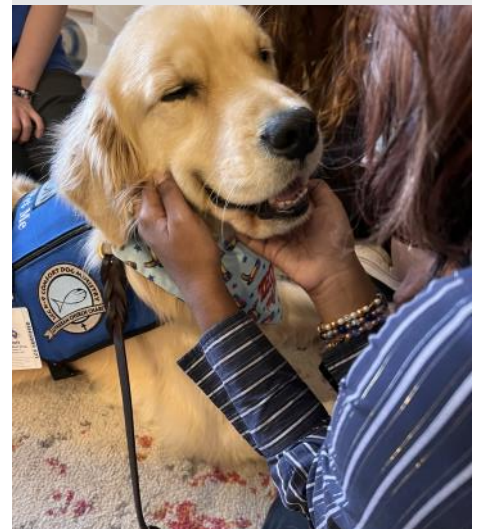

The Phoenix House is a facility that treats young people between the ages of 13-18 for drug and alcohol addiction. The visits we make twice a month involve meeting with small groups of clients that almost always leave us with a happy heart knowing that bringing Triton for them to love on gives them something to look forward to and brings calm and comfort. We are only there for 1 hour, but after the visits we try to ask the groups if we can pray with them, and they always emphatically answer yes! On one of our visits following the Uvalde deployment, we expressed our apologies that we had to cancel our visit since Triton and his team were sent to that community. We shared that we may have to cancel another appointment the following week as he may be going back to Uvalde. One of the young ladies stated that it was okay and that we should go there and help those people instead of coming to see them because they needed it more. That really touched my heart! That young lady may be struggling with addiction, but her thoughts were focused on others in need. It's moments like that when I feel so blessed to be a part of this ministry.
