One of the questions I get asked the most, these days, is: "What are you going to do once you're retired?" I've heard that question so much, I always give pretty much the same answer: "I'm going to be doing everything I love doing — counseling, art work, playing in the dirt, walking with church workers, and being that 'retired guy' who hangs around!" That means, of course, that I will qualify for membership in Messiah's premier men's group: the ROMEO group (Retired Old Men Eating Out)!

The question of what will I be doing – is an important one to ask – because men, in general, can easily slip into depression and a shortened life span if we don't include purposeful, meaningful, and fun activities after retirement. So many of us have worked most of our adult lives, and when we retire, the benefits of working slip away

as well. Benefits such as: recognition, achievement, routine, structure, and financial rewards are the noticeable ones. But, social interaction and friendship are critical, too, but less noticed.

Mr. Dennis Hiser, of our church, sent me a challenge called "The Retirement Riddle." (Dennis is one of my consultants, which helps men discover purposeful work. I've referred several men to his care. He's awesome!) Anyway, the Retirement Riddle looks at the big losses which occur at retirement: income and benefits; daily discipline; relationships, intellectual stimulation, and mattering. These are all the gifts which work brings, but which are changed when one's professional life changes.

When I'm walking with church workers, some of whom are in career changes, these are what we talk about. These are what I'm talking about, these days, too! My income and benefits will be covered by social security and my pension. I will also retain my counseling and coaching credentials, so that I can continue to offer that service. (I'll be at Messiah one day a week to counsel with people over here). The daily discipline might be a challenge, because of how Sundays will be different for me. For pastors, Sundays are what all the other days of the week point to. Sermons, Bible Studies, etc. create the discipline of the schedule and the routine. I'll have to work on that one!

Relationships will be affected, too, because I won't be at Messiah as much. You are all my friends, so I won't neglect that – it'll just be different.

I don't think I'll have worry about intellectual stimulation because I'm a lifelong learner. Plus, I'll be pursuing my oil painting classes, and trying – at last – to write my book.

Mattering is something that most men don't think about – but is so critical. Doing something useful and purposeful is not only good for the soul, but it continues to grow God's DNA within us. Remember what God put Adam in the Garden to do? Work it and take care of it. That's God's DNA is us! I have any number of ideas on how to do that – including the "honey do" list, which Victoria is building as we speak.

A Word From Pastor Lee Pray. Care. Share.

During our weekly Family Lenten services, the theme we have been learning about is "No Greater Love." This theme comes from John 3:16: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." In the season of Lent, the 40 days leading up to Easter, the focus of these Children's Ministry family services has been on the sacrificial love that our Savior Jesus showed to us by living



and dying as He gave up His life for us. We have been discovering topics like, "No Greater Sacrifice," "No Greater Mercy," "No Greater Encouragement," "No Greater Friend," and "No Greater Life."

Each week, we have also been taking part in challenges together. Each family received a set of three round cards. They have been challenged to pray for someone, to care for someone, and to share Jesus with someone: **Prayer. Care. Share.** In response to the greatest act of love from Jesus, we are driven to our knees in *prayer* – especially for those who do not know or believe in Christ and His love. It drives us to our feet as we run to *care* for others – especially those who need help, friendship, and compassion. It drives us to *share* – not just in actions, but also in words – the truth about Who Jesus is and what He has done for us. The purpose of the cards is to serve as a guide (outside of our Lenten services) as we live as followers of Jesus. Our hope is that students will form a regular practice of *praying*, *caring*, and *sharing* God's Word with others. Throughout these Lenten services, we have enjoyed a meal, fellowship, God's saving Word, and a strengthening of our faith. As we approach the celebration of Jesus' victory over sin and death on Resurrection Day (Easter Sunday), I pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to bless and guide us as we spend time together in His Word and *pray*, *care*, and *share*.



March 17- The Fifth Sunday in Lent



He is the Senior Advisor and Congregational Engagement minister for Lutheran World Relief (LWR). He has been involved with going to many of the countries where our donations are sent and handing out the personal care kits, the quilts, and other items to the people who need them. In 2023, there were 551,700 quilts and kits sent to 14 countries. This is an amazing number, but so many more were needed. We will be continuing this ministry here at Messiah, and I thank all of you for your participation.

COMFORT DOG MINISTRY








Did you know that when an LCC comfort dog is named they are also given their own bible verse? Triton's bible verse is Mark 10:45 "For even the son of man did not come to be served, but to serve. and to give his life as a ransom for many." I used to take Triton on bi-monthly visits to the Phoenix house in downtown Dallas.

Unfortunately, it recently lost funding, so it had to close. Carolyn Nussman made the first initial visit to meet with the staff and a few board members to establish a relationship and set up a visitation schedule in January 2020. And then, the Covid crisis hit and we were unable to make visits for quite

a while. Once they deemed it safe for visits, the handlers were required to go through drug and to testing as well as a background check to protect their residents. It was a lot of effort, but definitely worth it! We made bi-monthly visits to the Phoenix House for over two years and met several wonderful teenagers in the midst of battling drug and/or alcohol addiction. I began my experience as a ministry partner and then once I became a handler, it became my regular visit with Triton. There are many wonderful memories of how God used our time there, but one in particular stands out. One of the young men I had the privilege to watch grow with the Lord every visit with Triton as his bridge. On Triton's many bandanas are his Bible verse Mark 10:45, and during one visit this young man asked me about it. The next visit, his last before he was leaving, he declared he had chosen his own bible verse Psalm 37:19 "They will not be ashamed in the time of evil, and in the days of famine they will have abundance."



Triton's impact on our church and society is immeasurable. He is a beacon of hope and a constant reminder that even in the darkest of times, there is a light to guide us. With his unwavering loyalty and unconditional love, Triton continues to inspire and uplift our community making a lasting difference in the lives of those he encounters. Michele Haugen

What is the future of the Comfort Dog ministry at Messiah?



Did you know from the time we apply for a 'replacement" dog, the wait is approximately 3 years?

Triton is almost 7. We noticed at the annual conference this summer the dogs eternally deployed in the last several years the 'average' age of ministry dogs service was about 9 years. Messiah can't get in line for a replacement UNTIL we have a Top Dog and Caregiver in place. The Top Dog oversees the ministry team, communicates with LCC and other Top Dogs about the ministry, etc.. The dog lives with the caregiver and they are responsible for the care of the dog. (All expenses are reimbursed).

If we were to receive the replacement dog before Triton retires, the new dog would shadow Triton on all visits to establish itself with the current places he visits, and then when it's time for Triton to retire, the replacement then carries on the ministry work. 
