

Maundy Thursday GUIDED TO SERVICE



"Now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit." Romans 7:6 **GUIDED TO THE CROSS**—Welcome to this special service for Maundy Thursday. We read how Jesus washes the disciples' feet in service to them on His way to Calvary. In word and song, we contemplate how to live lives of service to others, guided by Christ and the cross.



THE INVOCATION AND LITANY

- P The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
- C Amen.
- On the night before He died, Jesus spoke to His disciples about many things—the betrayal and denial to come, the promised gift of the Holy Spirit and the peace that He alone can give: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid."

G Jesus, our Savior, set Your cross before us to guide us in the way of service.

Jesus told His disciples that He was the true vine and that, abiding in Him, they would bear fruit in works of love. He gave them a new commandment: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another."

G Jesus our Savior, teach us to love one another as You love us.

- On that same night of His betrayal, the night He would be abandoned by His disciples, Jesus gave them a lesson in love and service. The Lord of all took up a towel and a basin of water and washed His disciples' feet. The next day He would lay down His life for them, for us, for all people. As Jesus had said of Himself, "The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."
- **G** Jesus our Savior, set Your cross before us to guide us in the way of service.

j THE CONFESSION AND ANNOUNCEMENT OF FORGIVENESS

- Bearing our sins and in need of a Savior, let us go to our heavenly Father, asking for forgiveness. You are now invited to kneel. Most merciful, heavenly Father, You promised a covenant written on Your people's hearts.
- **G** But we do not always rely on Your promises and great love. We are sorry.
- Gracious Holy Spirit, through Your use of Word and Sacrament, many people know the Lord.
- **C** But we have not taken advantage of every opportunity to share Your Word with others. We are sorry.
- P Jesus taught that the greatest in the Kingdom is the servant of all.
- **G** But our hearts have not always been humble and eager for service. We are sorry. Our thoughts, words, and deeds fall short. As fallen sinners, we are helpless to change. For Jesus' sake, forgive us, and give us new and clean hearts to love You and serve our neighbors.
- God promised in the new covenant, "I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more." In the sacrifice of Himself, Jesus, being perfect, "became the source of eternal salvation." As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- **C** Lead us, Jesus, to walk in Your steps in the way of love and service. Amen.

μ THE COLLECT

- Lord and Savior, You are the Suffering Servant foretold by the prophet Isaiah. You did not come to be served, but to serve. You have commanded us to love one another. You did not only give the command, but followed it in Your own life and in Your redeeming death. You, the Master and Teacher, washed Your disciples' feet.
- To wash us clean from sin, You suffered and died on the cross as the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the world. Lead us by the power of the Holy Spirit to follow Your example in our lives. Teach us to serve others in love. Amen.

THE EPISTLE Romans 7:4-6

Likewise, my brothers, you also have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God. For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death. But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us

captive, so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit and not in the old way of the written code.

THE HOLY GOSPEL John 13:1-17

It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. ² The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. ³ Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; ⁴ so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. ⁵ After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him. ⁶ He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you

going to wash my feet?" ⁷ Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand." ⁸ "No," said Peter, "you shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with me." ⁹ "Then, Lord," Simon Peter replied, "not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!" ¹⁰ Jesus answered, "Those who have had a bath need only to wash their feet; their whole body is clean. And you are clean, though not every one of you." ¹¹ For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean. ¹² When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. ¹³ "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. ¹⁴ Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. ¹⁵ I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. ¹⁶ Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. ¹⁷ Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them.

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




THE LORD'S PRAYER

THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION



"Do this," He said, "till time shall end, remembering your dying Friend Meet at My table and record the full obedience of your Lord.


O Lord, Your feast we celebrate; we show Your death, we sing Your name Till You return, when we shall eat the marriage supper of the Lamb.

The Sacrament of Holy Communion

As You come to the Lord's Supper, you are affirming with each communicant that Jesus is your Savior and Lord, that with Lutheran Christians, you believe His Body and Blood are present and you desire to serve Him as a dynamic disciple in the fellowship of all believers. Our Holy Communion practice is called "CLOSE" communion, not "CLOSED" communion. "Close" communion invites all those who answer the following questions in the affirmative. We DO seek to help each visitor and member, to prepare for the celebration of the Sacrament. If you have not communed with us before, or if you cannot answer yes to the questions below, please speak to our Pastor or an Elder before communing.

- 1. Have I been baptized in the name of the Triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit?
- 2. Do I believe that I am a sinful human being without hope of eternal life except for God's mercy in Christ?
- 3. Do I believe that Jesus Christ is God's Son and my personal Savior from sin, death, and the power of the devil?
- 4. Do l believe that Jesus Christ is personally present in the Sacrament of Holy Communion with His true Body and Blood?
- 5. Do I intend, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to live a Godly life?

At Messiah, Communion is distributed in a manner whereby the individual cup, followed by the common cup, are offered at the same table. Communicants seated in the middle sections of the Sanctuary proceed to the altar first, standing behind the usher. Then the communicants in the side sections will proceed to the altar, also standing behind the usher. This will provide a prayerful setting surrounding the significance of receiving Christ's body and blood.

A light, alcohol-free wine is offered in clear glasses in the individual trays. Gluten-free wafers are available at the usher table in the back.
